THE POWER OF CONNECTION: HOW THE Y HELPED WINIFRED RECLAIM HER HEALTH AND JOY

At the YMCA, we believe in the power of connection where community, health, and hope come together to create real, lasting change. For many, the Y isn't just a place to work out it's a place to rebuild strength, rediscover purpose, and reconnect with others who care

For Winifred, that power made all the difference.

"I was faced with many health issues after being diagnosed with ankylosing spondylitis," she shared. "I struggled with mobility and at one point was in and out of hospitals and rehabilitation centers. I was wheelchair-bound, and the deterioration of my health had a major impact on what was once a busy and bustling life. I tried physical therapy, but the results were minimal, and I found myself sinking into depression. Life felt drab and joyless."

Encouraged by her daughter Anika and her physical therapist Laurie, Winifred decided to try something new, swimming at the Stratford YMCA.

"At first, I wasn't interested. I couldn't swim and thought it would be a disaster," Winifred said. "But from the moment I arrived, everyone was welcoming and encouraging. They helped me feel comfortable and supported."

With the help of Coach Nacho, Coach Luis, and lifeguards Logan and Daniel, Winifred began to make progress. Her confidence grew with every class, and so did her strength.

"I started attending as many classes as I could and began to feel better. I even signed up for swimming lessons for seniors and now I'm swimming over 30 laps! I have an active social life again, and I feel like myself. At one point, I thought my life was over, but with the support of everyone at the YMCA, I am now a healthier, happier version of myself."

Winifred's story is a beautiful reminder that health and wellness go far beyond physical fitness. They're about belonging, purpose, and connection, the heart of what the Y provides every day.

ALPHA COMMUNITY SERVICES YMCA OPENS COLD-WEATHER SHELTER IN BRIDGEPORT

As temperatures begin to drop, the **Alpha Community Services YMCA (ACSY)** in Bridgeport is once again opening its doors, and its heart, to those in need. Beginning this month, ACSY will serve as the region's cold-weather shelter, providing life-saving care and support for individuals experiencing homelessness.

From **November through April**, the shelter offers a **safe**, **warm place to rest** for up to **55 guests each night**. Every person who enters is welcomed with compassion, a hot meal, and the dignity they deserve. Guests receive both **dinner and breakfast**, ensuring that no one leaves hungry or without care during the harsh winter months.

This important program reflects the very core of the YMCA's mission; strengthening community through **caring, responsibility, and respect**. The shelter not only provides immediate relief but also connects individuals to long-term resources that can help them rebuild stability and hope.


